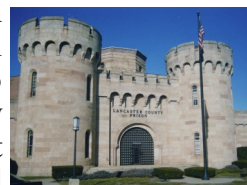
IMPACTING LANCASTER COUNTY, PA and BEYOND by:

Inviting churches, businesses, and individuals to partner financially with local mission opportunities

For 2019, we will continue with our contract to provide chaplain services and Christian programs at Lancaster County Prison. We have 9 paid staff and 12 regular badged chaplain volunteers providing about 1,100 hours of ministry a month. Annually, we respond to about 11,000 requests for services and/or contacts with inmates. Our chaplaincy department coordinates prison worship services with about 19 churches. LCP has about 1,000 inmates; 90% men, 10% women. SFPM also has 2 paid chaplains and 3 volunteers that minister in other County & State prisons.



At Lancaster County Youth Intervention Center we have 3 part-time chaplains, 2 volunteer chaplains, and about 15 church groups and area pastors who minister to about 30-40 juvenile residents in detention and shelter care.

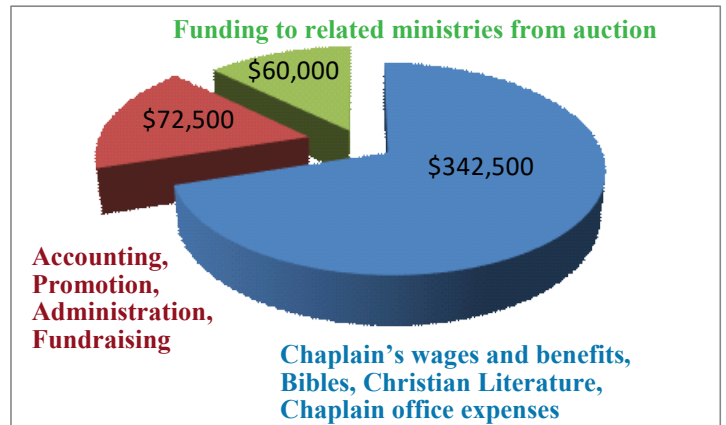
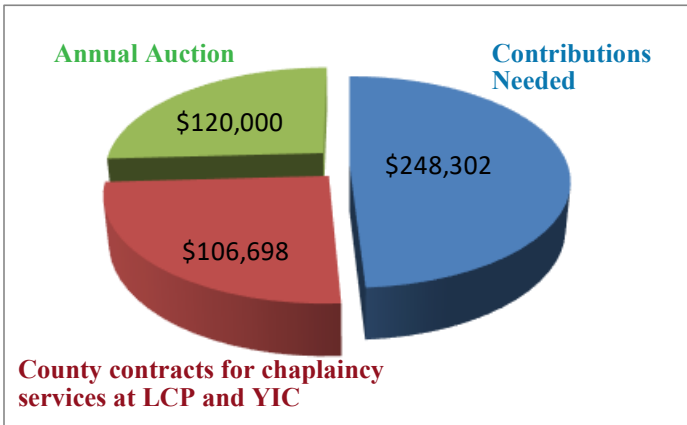

This coming from a Lancaster Prison inmate:

"Prison isn't a place of comfort, but it is a place of change. I have rekindled my connection with God. This wouldn't have been possible without the help of your chaplains."

I was ministering at a prison one Sunday and as I preached my eyes fixed on a member of the audience who stood out from the rest of over 100 men. He was quite tattooed including his face and I could tell he was deeply interested in my message. From the man's disposition I assumed he was part of a small religion prevalent in prison that blends occult teaching with their ethnic religion. After the message, which was based on our adversary Satan, he came to me and was bubbling over on how he never knew that so much of God's power over Satan was written in the Bible and then followed by making a commitment to learn more about the Bible. These misled individuals are the type that cross the lives of our chaplains regularly in prison and many just need to know there is an alternative in Jesus Christ than being enslaved to sin.
