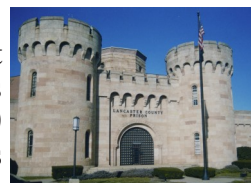
Special Update for January 2020

IMPACTING LANCASTER COUNTY, PA and BEYOND by:

Sharing God’s love and hope to men and women in prison; **Assisting** the church and concerned persons to get involved in prison ministry; **Inviting** churches, businesses, and individuals to partner financially with us.

Our ministry in 2019 was one of our best years. Katie Harnish was selected County Chaplain of the year in PA. Officials of both LCP and YIC have acknowledged outstanding performances by our chaplains. Streams of Life, our state prison ministry, continues to receive acknowledgement on its work in the state DOC and receives scores of letters from inmates thanking us. The Schuylkill County project where we have teamed with Jubilee in placing chaplains has gone extremely well. All this is only possible with God’s direction and blessing.

For 2020, we will continue to provide chaplain services and Christian programs at Lancaster County Prison. We have 10 paid staff and 13 regular badged chaplain volunteers providing about 1,100 hours of ministry a month. Annually, we respond to about 11,000 requests for services and/or contacts with inmates. Our chaplaincy department coordinates prison worship services with about 19 churches. LCP has about 800 inmates; 90% men, 10% women. SFPM also has 2 paid chaplains and 5 volunteers that minister in other County & State prisons.



At Lancaster County Youth Intervention Center we have 3 part-time chaplains, 2 volunteer chaplains, and about 15 church groups and area pastors who minister to about 30-40 juvenile residents in detention and shelter care.

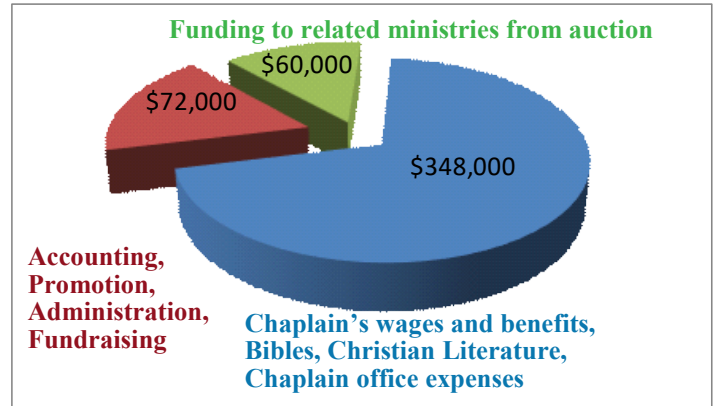
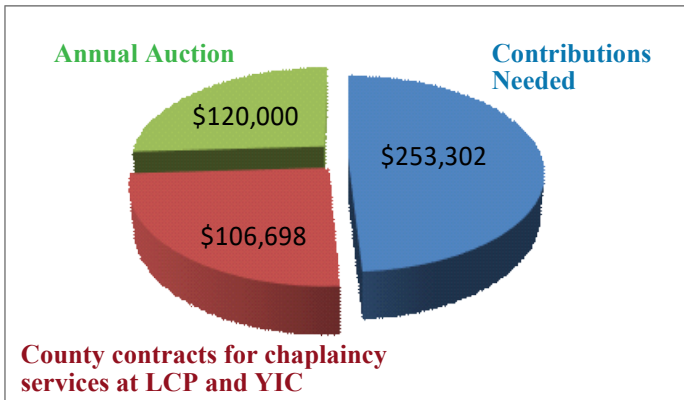
